Subject: Resolutions adopted by 45th All India Police Science Congress

BPR&D organized 45th All India Police Science Congress as co-host with Kerala Police at Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala on 8-9 December, 2016. The Congress was attended by delegates /officials of States, Union Territories, Govt. of India, CAPFs/ CPOs, Forensic Science Laboratories and National Law Universities.

2. The congress was held on following 04 themes:

1. Use of Technology for Better Investigation
2. Counter Terrorism and De-radicalization
3. Use of Appropriate Non-Lethal Measures for Crowd Control
4. Traffic Management to Reduce Fatalities in Road Accidents

The Congress was inaugurated by Shri Pinarayi Vijayan, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Kerala State on December 8, 2016. Hon'ble Chief Minister also released "Compendium" prepared jointly by the BPR&D and Kerala Police, comprising various research papers/ articles on above themes. Shri Justice (Retd.) P. Sathasivam, Hon'ble Governor of Kerala delivered the valedictory address on December 9, 2016.

4. After detailed deliberation 11 resolutions were adopted by 45th All India Police Science Congress: A copy of the resolutions is enclosed as for further necessary action.

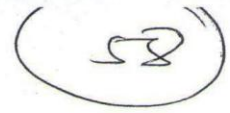

Resolutions adopted by 45th All India Police Science Congress (AIPSC)
held on 8-9 December, 2016 at Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala

1. Continued Central Govt. funding for implementation of CCTNS project beyond 2017 for its successful implementation by all states, creation of National Database of crime and criminals and its accessibility to the police and investigation agencies.
2. A comprehensive legislation for Human DNA profiling should be enacted to establish National DNA Data base and its use for investigation purpose.
3. Legal Provision for sharing Adhaar biometric data for investigation purpose.
4. There should be a central repository in BPR&D on various applications and technologies developed and being used by different police/CAPFs/CPOs which should be accessible to all the police forces.
5. There should be a Central Lead Agency to coordinate the de-radicalisation efforts of various State and Central agencies.
6. Training Courses should be organized for Prison staff to sensitize them about radicalization of prisoners and to take necessary preventive measures.
7. Beat Policing in the country should be strengthened for better intelligence collection.
8. There should close coordination among Research institutions, industries and end users for development of non-lethal/ less-lethal measures of crowd control.
9. Rash and negligent act of driving leading to death should be made a non-boilable offence with more severe punishment.
10. There should be mandatory consultation with police at planning stage of urban planning and road construction.
11. Traffic fines collected by the police should be provided to the police to improve infrastructure for traffic regulation.
